Notice of Obtaining a "B" Score in CDP's "Climate Change Report 2024"

erex Co., Ltd. (Head Office: Chuo-Ward, Tokyo; Representative Director and President: Hitoshi Honna; hereinafter referred to as "the Company") is pleased to announce that the Company has obtained a "B" score in the 2024 Climate Change Questionnaire conducted by Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP), an international environmental non-profit organization.

Note

The Company has been responding to the Climate Change Questionnaire conducted by CDP, an environmental non-profit organization, since last fiscal year. The Company has now responded to the 2024 questionnaire and obtained a "B" score.

"B" score is considered to be at the "management level" in CDP's evaluation criteria, meaning that the Company is aware of the risks and opportunities associated with climate change and is taking specific actions, and is the third highest on the eight-level scale (A, A-, B, B-, C, C-, D, D-).

The Company has been continuously promoting its efforts toward the spread of renewable energy and de-carbonization. The Company believes that this score indicates that its environmental efforts have been recognized to a certain extent.



The Company will continue to promote environmental initiatives under its 2030 vision "To Become a Pioneer in the New Era of Electric Power with Renewable Energy at Its Core".

About CDP

Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) is an international environmental non-governmental organization (NGO) established in the United Kingdom in 2000 that operates a global environmental disclosure system for companies and municipalities. It surveys the efforts of companies and cities around the world to address environmental issues such as climate change, water security, and forests, and discloses the results of its evaluation. CDP surveyed more than 23,000 corporations, representing two-thirds of the world's market capitalization, in fiscal year 2023, the largest number ever surveyed on climate change. The companies are evaluated on an eight-level scale (A, A-: leadership level; B, B-: management level; C, C-: awareness level; D, D-: information disclosure level) in terms of their climate change targets, business strategies, awareness of risks and opportunities, and disclosure of greenhouse gas emissions.
